



Pack correctly Shop as usual

An EU rule restricts the quantity of liquids, lotions, gels and sprays in your hand baggage when you go through security screening. So packing correctly is important.

Avoid liquids, or pack them carefully in your check-in baggage. Liquids needed during your trip must be packed in cans/bottles, each no more than 100 ml (3 ½ oz). You may carry as many cans/bottles as will fit into a single transparent one litre (35 oz) plastic bag. You must show this plastic bag at the security screening point.



You may also carry medicines, baby food and liquid included in a special diet you need during the flight.

Shopping after you pass through security screening is not affected. You may shop as before and carry your purchases into the aircraft.

Shop as usual

You may still buy duty- and tax-free as well as other goods in the shops located after the security screening point, and you may take them on board the aircraft even if they are in cans and bottles each containing more than 100 ml.

To think about

To make sure that you don't risk confiscation of goods you bought in shops located after the security screening point or in countries with no restrictions on liquids in hand baggage:

From Sweden to another airport without changing aircraft

You can buy liquids in shops after security screening and take it along in your hand baggage.

From Sweden and changing aircraft in an EU country

You may buy liquids in shops after security screening and take it along in your hand baggage. Make sure the shop seals the bag so it is possible to ensure that no additional containers have been placed inside the bag after your purchase. You must also be able to show receipts for your purchases, which must have been made within the past 24 hours.

From Sweden and changing aircraft in the United States

You may not carry liquids you bought in duty- and tax-free shops in Sweden in your hand baggage through the security screening point you must go through in the US before your continued journey.

From Sweden to the US with a change of aircraft in another EU country

You should not have a problem if you buy duty- and tax-free goods when changing aircraft in an EU country to take along on your flight to the United States, provided you are not later changing aircraft in the US. But to be on the safe side, check with your airline to make sure that the particular EU country that you are transiting does not have stricter rules.

From Sweden and changing aircraft in the US or non-EU countries

Countries outside the EU may have their own hand baggage restrictions. Please contact your airline to find out what rules will apply to your journey.

Keep in mind that the rules for liquids in hand baggage when travelling back to Sweden and other EU countries have also changed. Find out what rules apply to your journey.
